## Diagnostic criteria for cranial giant cell arteritis, according to [3,9].

Criteria	Description
1	Age ≥ 50 years
2	Typical cranial symptoms*
3	Unequivocal symptoms of polymyalgia rheumatica
4	Erythrocyte sedimentation rate > 30 mm per one hour <u>or</u> C-reactive protein
	> 1 mg/dl
5	Hypoechogenic wall thickening (halo) of the superficial temporal arteries or
	positive temporal artery biopsy.
